### **2. The Man who is utterly Powerless is All Powerful**

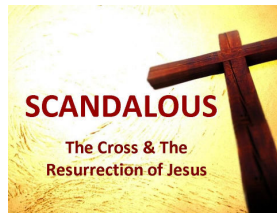
